## The Wolves Are Here

According to author Dave Grossman, people can be divided into one of three groups:

- Wolves,
- Sheepdogs
- Sheep

To better understand Grossman's assertion, we need to first understand the definitions for each group.

Most animal species, including sheep, cluster together in herds, flocks, packs, schools, swarms, etc. Clustering is done for a number of reasons such as:

- Socializing
- Protection in numbers
- Synergistic energy
- Survival of the most fit
- Collective vigilance
- Anti-predatory behavior
- Being relatively low on the food chain

## Are you a sheep - placid and easily manipulated?

God, and Jesus often refer to us as sheep because sheep represent purity and innocence. If you are a sheep, you need to trust God for your safety. But trust is not the only thing that God calls upon you to do.

Surrounding all sheep are predators waiting to pounce, kill and feed on the animal.

Grossman calls the human world predators, Wolves. Wolves exist in the shadows outside the easily penetrable perimeter that surrounds the sheep. They are sociopaths who commit violent crimes or ignore moral or ethical boundaries with impunity. They take



advantage of the sheep's tendency to be inexperienced with evil, unprepared for attack, and caught flat-footed when a crisis arises.

Wolves can act independently (lone wolf) or as a pack. Regardless, both types seek out the weakest and then devour the sheep up the food chain of victims.

There are two types of wolf packs. Most people are familiar with the most common wolf pack among people – the gangs that prey on both individuals, and communities. Their goal is to obtain money through fear and control of people.

The second type of pack is much like a gang but is not as easily recognizable as it stays hidden, out-of-sight. Its victims are individuals, communities/groups, and government. Their goal is power through intimidation and control over the people. This type of pack has been called various names such as "The Deep State," "The New World Order," etc. This pack's intent is to destroy the United States and cast everyone but a very select few into a pool of poverty.

Since our nation's beginning, individuals have protected the sheep from the wolves. In the Bible, these people were called shepherds. Their duties were to protect the sheep from predators, thieves, the environment, and to ensure that the sheep are well kept and healthy. In one case a shepherd (David) came forth to also protect his nation from the wolves of the Philistines.

Shepherds however were not only people but also dogs which vigilantly protected the sheep. Without question both man and dog would go after the predators.


To protect against these wolf packs, Sheepdogs need additional strategic and tactical support. They need the sheep to also participate in their own protection.
